

The five-year plan will leverage a total of more than \$120 million in state, local, federal, and private system resources. The grant was funded at \$7 million over three years, plus matching funds from the Parkland Foundation, Dallas County, City of Dallas, and state funds under SB 292.

In year one, funding was \$3.5 million. In years two and three, funding is \$1.75 million for each year.



April 2018: The 911 Dispatch Clinician rolls out and begins assisting with mental health calls for all patrol divisions






RIGHT Care Call Data

MMHPI conducted a preliminary analysis on call data provided by the Dallas Police Department, Parkland Hospital, and Dallas Fire-Rescue of the first 120 days of deployment. This analysis provides a snapshot of the team's productivity, which has yielded favorable outcomes.

Funding Opportunities

- **85(R) SB 292** created a **\$37.5 million grant program** (\$12.5 million in FY 2018, \$25 million in FY 2019) to reduce recidivism, arrest, and incarceration among individuals with mental illness.
- **85(R) HB 13** created a **\$30 million grant program** (\$10 million in FY 2018, \$2 million in FY 2019) to support community mental health programs that provide services and treatment to individuals experiencing mental illness.
