

### **Mission Statement**


To provide independent, non-partisan, and trusted policy and program guidance that creates systemic changes so all Texans can obtain effective, efficient behavioral health care when and where they need it.





# **The Progression of Mental Health Conditions**

- <u>Half</u> of all mental health conditions manifest by <u>age 14</u>.
- Like all diseases, care works best <u>at this early stage</u> when symptoms are *less severe*, *more treatable*, and *more readily prevented from escalating* to conditions that increase <u>risk</u>.
- <u>75% of children</u> with mental health issues who receive care today are treated in a primary care setting.
- By young adulthood, **75% of lifetime cases** have presented.



# **SB 10: Texas Mental Health Care Consortium**

- ACCESS TO CARE: To coordinate the expansion and delivery of mental health care services by leveraging the infrastructure and expertise of state-funded medical schools and community providers – <u>to deliver care that we know works</u>.
- RESEARCH: To promote collaborations in mental health and substance use disorder research across Texas university systems to advance the research component of the Statewide Behavioral Health Strategic Plan – <u>to discover what can work better</u>.
- WORKFORCE: To build a skilled psychiatric workforce for the public mental health system – <u>to teach new doctors what works</u>.
