The Webmaster will design, develop, and maintain two existing Institute websites: mmhpi.org and okaytosay.org. The Webmaster must be a dedicated problem solver who can work efficiently and effectively in coordination with cross-functional teams.

The Webmaster will also provide support for digital communication initiatives, including custom HTML or CSS content for emails, social media, and digital ads working with the Meadows Institute's inhouse Communications team. The Webmaster will own management, maintenance, and search engine optimization for two websites. A strong knowledge of WordPress and WordPress Plugins is required.

The ideal candidate is self-motivated and able to contribute in a fast-paced environment while maintaining quality of performance and adherence to deadlines.

Responsibilities:

- Day-to-day oversight and maintenance of the Meadows Institute's two websites: mmhpi.org and okaytosay.org;
- Implement website content updates, build new pages, and add new features as needed;

- Review site content and update with current Search Engine Optimization (SEO) trends;
- Keep up to date with and implement best practices and industry standards for user experience, SEO, visual design, performance, and security;
- Work collaboratively with Communications team members to ensure alignment with organizational goals, adherence to brand and style guidelines, communicate project updates, and meet the needs of leadership and teams across the Institute;
- Respond to user complaints quickly and appropriately;
