

Job Title: Research Assistant for the Center for Child and Family Wellness

Reports To: Senior Project Manager for the Center for Child and Family Wellness

Position Summary: The Meadows Mental Health Policy Institute (Meadows Institute) seeks a Research Assistant to support the Center for Child and Family Wellness in Fall 2022. The Research Assistant will work on developing engagement strategies and communications for a project focused on supporting the mental health of young people with experience in foster care. Job responsibilities for this position may include planning and participating in qualitative research, including interviews and focus groups with young people with experience in foster care. The preferred work location for this position is in Dallas, Texas, although the majority of job responsibilities will be performed remotely. Some duties may require access to reliable personal transportation. This is a paid part-time position around 15-20 hours per week for 12-14 weeks.

Responsibilities:

- Schedule and participate in meetings.
- Edit project documents and materials.
- Support in gathering and synthesizing qualitative research, including scheduling interviews and participating and taking notes in interviews.
- Identify relevant quantitative data points.
- Support project youth engagement strategy and overall strategy.
- Organize project documentation.
- Other duties as assigned.

Required Qualifications:

- Bachelor's degree in social work, political science, sociology, anthropology, psychology, public health, or related field.
- Recent graduate or graduate student enrolled in a master's or doctoral program.
- Excellent written and verbal communication skills.
- Ability to work independently as well as collaboratively with colleagues. This includes overcoming geographic and other potential barriers to communicating with and making contributions to the team's work.
- Excellent organizational skills, including the ability to manage multiple tasks and projects simultaneously while meeting deadlines.
- Capacity to think strategically, critically, and respond analytically.

Flexibility in working with new issues, topics, and approaches.

Preferred Qualifications:

- Interest in mental health, child welfare, and/or public policy.
- Experience with the child welfare system (this could be through personal experience or other experiences supporting the success of young people with foster care histories).

Eligibility Requirements:

• The preferred work location for this position is in Texas. This position may not be filled or performed in Colorado at this time. Relocation assistance is not available. Successful candidates must show proof of eligibility to work in the United States.
